I don't want to work with Ana today. I saw the supervisor touching her body yesterday. I keep seeing him pull her into his office alone.




That's not Ana's fault! That's sexual harassment! The supervisor was doing that to Yesenia a couple months ago. It's against the law. She got help, and he backed off.




If he's doing that to Ana and Yesenia, he is doing it to others, I helped Yesenia out by giving a statement, and it got better for her.



I don't want to put my job on the line for this. Weren't you afraid to get fired?



A little, but it's against the law to fire someone just for reporting harassment. And I'm still here right? Man, you gotta say something about what you saw.



Yeah, you're right. I don't want him to keep doing this, and I know Ana has kids at home and is probably really scared for her job.
